Lord's Prayer Tour

The tour has begun! A service of Choral Evensong at York Minster on Friday 7 March marked the start of the Lord's Prayer Tour across the North of England. Following the service around 130 people gathered in the Lady Chapel for a drinks reception and to hear more from Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell, about his hopes for the tour. There was also a time of Q&A and a short presentation from the Revd Canon Dr Mark Powley, the Archbishop's Mission Enabler for the North who shared more widely about Faith in the North and its focus on renewal of prayer, mission, storytelling and church planting.



During the service the Choir of York Minster sang a newly commissioned piece of music written by young composer Lucy Walker. Lucy was tasked with creating a new setting of the Lord's Prayer and the composition was premiered last Friday.

In an interview with UCB radio, Lucy commented on the process of writing the piece. She said, "...to revisit words that are so familiar and reinject the meaning on the personal level and a universal level, was really exciting. Music has been used for centuries to amplify how we worship using words, and to do that with something that's so familiar felt almost daunting in some way, to make sure that the message being communicated was not being overpowered by something musically. I think we have to remember that the prayer isn't just lyric. It's a prayer in its own right, and the partnership between music and text is a really fine balance to strike." Many of those present at the service commented on the beauty of the piece and how it brought a freshness to the Lord's Prayer. It is hoped that all the places hosting the tour will be able to incorporate the piece into the event.


